For many years, Rick also taught high school humanities in Laconia. He writes that all his work is connected with service, community, and the well-being that grows from kindness. ~ Becky

As I was serving at a recent community dinner in the Parish House Community Center, a newcomer to town appeared. Contrary to all Yankee stereotyping, folks warmly welcomed her and invited her to share their table. But before she could sit down, she laid out a delicious dish she'd prepared to share with people she'd never met. Others asked me: What's her name? Where does she live? Do you think it would be OK if I asked her

for the recipe? And I felt my faith renewed in our little community.

Selfless generosity and kindness, as particular as a casserole and an invitation to "come sit here," gentles our world. They don't require an ideology, a religion, or an organized belief system. Actually, some systems oppose compassion, kindness, and virtue as signs of weakness and vulnerability. But I believe the contrary, that when all is said and done, I will be remembered not for riches or success but the way I treated my fellow human beings. While cruelty and hatred seem ascendant in our world,

we can still choose to act with compassion, generosity, and kindness in our little town, in our small state, and in our own lives. I believe this will add meaning to our lives, and while, as Viktor Frankl said, "Happiness cannot be pursued; it must ensue," we just might find our happiness through our choice to love, to share, and to care.

Town of Canterbury News

The Town Clerk/Tax Collector's office will be closed May 14th for Training. They will also be closed, along with the Town Office on Monday May 26 for Memorial Day.

Michelle Hammond has been hired to fill the Land Use Administrator position. Michelle has been the Secretary for the Planning Board, Historic District Commission and Solid Waste Committee. We once again say thank you to Jan Stout for having filled this position temporarily since last fall.

The town is working with Aries engineering on the suitability study of an upgrade at the Transfer Station.

Representatives from the Board of Selectmen, Solid Waste

Representatives from the Board of Selectmen, Solid Waste Committee, Highway Dept. plus the Town Administrator and Transfer Station manager met with Aries for a walkthrough of the facility on Wednesday, April 23.

UPDATE: SLH Garage Renovation Project. The bids the Town has received for the renovation of the garage at the Town Office are going to be opened at the Board of Selectmen's meeting on May 5. Note: The bidding process was open from April 7, 2025 and closed on May 1, 2025.

The insulation work at the library was completed the week of April 14. This should result in lower heating and cooling costs for many years. The town applied for a grant from NHSaves for a portion of the cost. We should have the final figures next month.

The Fireworks at Canterbury Elementary School will be held on Saturday, July 5 with a rain date of Saturday, July 12. Once again, JPI Pyrotechnics will be providing the show.

The annual audit of the Town's finances is being conducted by Plodzik and Sanderson.

Regular Board of Selectmen's meetings are Monday, May 5 and Monday, May 19, 6pm in the Meeting House.

Styrofoam Now Collected at Our Transfer Station — Recycled in Gilford

Hard, white packing foam, otherwise known as expanded polystyrene(EPS) or Styrofoam, is a difficult to recycle material that most Towns don't accept. You can identify it by looking for a #6 recycle symbol somewhere on the material. Gilford is the first NH hub for foam collection and recycling!

Heads Up: New Ban on Lithium-ion batteries in the trash!!

Starting July 1, 2025 it will be illegal to put rechargeable lithiumion batteries in the trash! They must be recycled through special battery collection programs and NEVER mixed with regular trash or recyclables. This new lithium-



ion battery disposal ban has been added to the existing ban for lead acid batteries and electronic devices in RSA 149-M:27.

Lithium-ion batteries are used in a wide variety of consumer products, including:

- · Automotive vehicles.
- · Electric bikes and scooters.
- Lawncare equipment.
- Portable electronics such as cell phones, laptops, tablets, cameras, wireless headphones, speakers, rechargeable toothbrushes and other rechargeable electronic devices.
- · Cordless power tools.
- Toys

Where can I recycle my lithium-ion batteries?

The Canterbury Transfer Station is able to collect these items. **<u>DO NOT</u>** put them in the green bags or the packer! Make sure to ask an attendant where to place the items when you drop them off.

If you aren't able to make it to the Transfer Station, many businesses like Staples, Best Buy, or BatteriesPlus in Concord offer collection boxes for recycling rechargeable batteries. To find a drop-off site nearby, check <u>Call2Recycle.org</u>, or visit one of the retail locations mentioned above. Remember – if it's rechargeable, it's recyclable!

The Annual Canterbury Plant Swap, Wednesday, May 14, 6:00-7:00pm

Find the Swap in the gazebo in the center of town. Bring your labeled, divided perennials, bulbs and native plants, or extra flower and vegetable seedlings you might have.

Due to the transmission of the invasive jumping worm that can happen when swapping plants, we ask that you **bring all dug plants as bare root**. Use a high-pressure setting on your hose to spray all the soil off. Bring your plants in shallow trays or plastic bags with enough water to keep the roots moist.

The Swap is open to anyone in town no matter your gardening experience. If you're new to Canterbury, it's a great way to pick up some plants to landscape your yard and meet your neighbors at the same time. There's always plenty to share so come even

if you don't have much to bring.

The President's Report

Canterbury Historical Society

2025 has been busy with various committees working on several significant projects. Of particular note is the creation of the Tricentennial Committee, co-chaired by Naomi Scanlon and Heidi Southard, that is tasked with coordinating the Town's celebration of its Tricentennial in 2027. The committee is considering various events to be conducted throughout the year and is actively looking for volunteers to participate in the celebrations.

The "One Room Schoolhouse" Committee is working with the Canterbury Elementary School (CES) to conduct the one room schoolhouse program at the Houser Museum in May for all CES students. This is the 16th year of the program. This year's event will focus on the 1930's and include topics on music, railroads, hobos, and current events of the era.

With the emergence of Spring, the "Cellar Hole" Committee is preparing for new explorations of cellar holes, foundations, and abandoned historic sites. Volunteers are needed for research and exploration, a good opportunity for an enjoyable walk in the woods. (See summary below on the results of one exploration).

The "Historic Homes" Committee continues to prepare descriptions of 18th and early 19th century homes in the community with the goal of publishing a book for the Tricentennial celebration.

Community Education - In an attempt to expand knowledge of our history, various lectures and information sessions are being planned and will be offered throughout the year. Our first lecture of the year is scheduled for May 15, 2025, presented by Dr. Glen Rogers on "Count Rumford of Concord". We encourage everyone to attend this informative presentation.

CHS Website - Lastly, Alan Stone has been working with each of the CHS committees to upgrade the Society's website and create a truly integrated data base which will allow access to a broader range of Society materials. While still in the developmental stage, this effort should greatly enhance historical research as well as provide an accessible centralized resource for capturing and presenting information about Canterbury.
